

# **Organizational Highlights**

- Appointed two new members to our Board of Directors, **Ramone Alexander** and **Caitlin Corr Reilly**, each bringing years of leadership experience from key roles played in the education sector.
- Welcomed a new Program Officer for Education, **Mary Lou Rubé**, and promoted a seven-year staff member, **Nick Schifano**, to Program Officer for Performing Arts, strengthening our team of professionals working with 90+ grantee partners.
- Wrapped up **10 years of charitable giving** under our current, staffed model which has disbursed nearly **\$47 million** in cash grants from 2015 through 2024 to Western New York's education and performing arts nonprofits.
- Hosted free professional development trainings attended by **123 unique nonprofit professionals from 71 local organizations** around the topics of financial management, fundraising, succession planning, and board governance. Created in partnership with New York Council on Nonprofits, Inc. (**NYCON**), the 6 workshops created peer learning opportunities for our grantees' staff and board members.

# **Education Highlights**

- Through **Buffalo Urban Teaching Fellows**, an "earn and learn" teacher training program, provided \$350k in direct tuition support to **55 Teaching Fellows** enrolled in 5 local universities and serving in 33 preK-12 schools, bolstering the pipeline of future teachers preparing to **serve Buffalo's students** in the near future.
- Awarded nearly **\$900k** across **12 Buffalo Charter Schools** through our **Charter School Cohort Program**, a collaborative model focusing on **Early Literacy Tutoring**, **Early Literacy Curriculum**, **Early College**, and **Talent**.
- Seventh year of significant program support to Say Yes Summer Camp, which served 1,792 Buffalo Pre-K to grade 6 students in a six-week, evidence-based, academic and enrichment program featuring 31 partner camp sites.
- Provided high dosage capacity building supports to **43** Supplemental Academic Program (SAPs) grantees through Cullenfunded engagements:
  - 9 SAP grantees received 1:1 technical assistance from VIA Evaluation, CGR, and Daemen IGNITE in a range of services — from the development of logic models to data collection planning to researching best practices — all aimed at strengthening academic programs serving Buffalo's PreK to grade 12 students.
  - 14 SAP grantees underwent third party evaluations of their SAP programs with leading community-capacity builder, Chapin Hall.
  - 38 SAP grantees received direct support from Chapin Hall in implementing academic and SEL assessment tools into their PreK to grade 12 programs.
  - 3 SAP grantees completed **Network for Good's** yearlong Jumpstart fundraising bootcamp.
- Grew the Cullen Scholars program's total investment to **\$2.4 million**, assisting **5**7 middle school and high school students with tuition and wrap-around supports at local private schools from 2016 to 2024.

## **Performing Arts Highlights**

- Strengthened the local performing arts sector's **talent pipeline** through a **third cohort** of the **Cullen Fellows** program, awarding **5** promising leaders grant funding to advance their skills and learning. This 18-month program includes guidance and mentorship from cohort facilitators **Kimberly Rampersad** and **Tim Jennings** of the renowned **Shaw Festival Theatre**.
- Supported **33** WNY performing arts organizations through a mix of program, general operating, capital, and capacity-building grants, further enabling local artistic program development, audience building, and operation stabilization to benefit WNY's enthusiastic arts audiences.
